Green Angels Subsidy Program

The Green Angels Subsidy Fund provides admission passes, school programming, coverage of school transportation costs, and child, adult and family programming. The program also helps fund virtual learning through our online RBG at Home series and virtual school programming. These programs include technology-based digital programming that can improve social connections to the outside world.

New in 2022 and triggered by the rising of costs of goods and inflation, RBG approved the expansion of the Green Angel Subsidy Program guidelines to include supporting adults and seniors who are also experiencing financial hardships.

Movie Night in Hendrie Park


