Nature sanctuaries and trails

RBG's nature sanctuaries consist of 2,400 acres of Carolinian forest, Niagara Escarpment cliffs, rare oak savannah and coastal wetlands accessed by 27 km of walking trails. They are home to more than 50 at-risk species and a major stopover point for thousands of migratory birds. Nature sanctuaries are open daily 8 a.m. to dusk unless otherwise posted. rbg.ca/trails Paid parking applies (included with membership).
